


Fig. 1 Fig. 2



Item 1 1x optical fibre transfer system distribution and termination box - L

Item 2 25 m micro-duct pipe Ø10x2.0 mm

(fitted)

Note!

- Micro-duct pipe + 25 m internal optical fibre micro cable.
- Number of fibres = number of LC - APC connectors.

Item 3 1x measurement and test report

Note!

Retain the measurement and test report for safekeeping, and pass on to the service provider for further work processes.

Item 4 1x seal

Item 5 Accessories kit:

3x dowels S6 **(6)** 3x fastening screws 4x40 **(7)**

2x strain reliefs (8)
for micro-duct pipes Ø10
(Push and pull strain relief
in the optical fibre transfer
manhole)

5 Step 1 – Installing the cabinet on the wall

Required tools (not included)



Dimensions for mounting holes 5.2



- Warning!
 Check for any existing lines in the wall prior to drilling (gas, water, power)!
- Risk of electric shock!

5.3 Fastening the cabinet on the wall



Note!

Do not yet remove the seal (4)! It is only removed during commissioning (see section 6.2 "Step 2").

• Drill 3 holes with a diameter of 6 mm (1).

From the accessories kit:

- Insert 3x dowels S6 (2)
- Use 3x raised countersunk screws 4x40 (3) to fasten the cabinet to the wall.

5.4 Example: Guiding the micro-duct pipe outwards




Once the optical fibre transfer system distribution and termination box - L has been installed, we recommend routing the micro-duct pipe (1) outwards solely through the Langmatz "VarioPipe optical fibre building cable & pipe entry system - that may be built over" (2).

(The optical fibre building cable & pipe entry system is not included with delivery.

Order it using Langmatz art. no. 094592012).

6 Step 2 - Commissioning


6.1 Required tools (not included)



- 1 Cutter (to open the seal)
- 2 Torx screwdriver T20 (to open the cover)

6.2 Opening the seal



- On delivery, the cabinet is secured by a seal (1).
- Use a cutter to open the seal.

6.3 Opening the cover



Use a Torx screwdriver to unscrew 4x cover screws (1)
 (Torz - M4)
 and remove the cover (2).

6.4 Attaching the LC-APC patch cable




Pre-installed couplers with loop connectors (2).

 Press the 24x loop connectors (1) upwards and pull out downwards.



This is prepared to make it easier to insert the optical fibre cables into the port seal (1).

Remove the port seals (1) from the cabinet.





- Use a cutting tool (1) to completely cut through the front and rear side of the port seal as far as the second hole (2).
- 24x optical fibre cable version.



 Insert the LC-APC patch cable (2) into the cabinet and connect it to the couplers (1).

6.5 Inserting the LC-APC patch cable into the port seal



Insert the optical fibre cables Ø 1.8 –
 Ø 3.4 mm (1) into the sides of the port seal (2).

Refer to section 6.6 for a layout plan for outgoing optical fibre cables in the port seal!

6.6 Layout plan - Optical fibre cables



Block "A": slots 1 - 12

Block "B": slots 13 - 24


Block "C": slots 25 - 36

Block "D": slots 37 - 48

Note:

Cut off the upper part of the port seal (1) for cables with a diameter of more than 2.8 mm.

6.7 Complete port seal



Insert the fully assembled port seal (1) into the cabinet.

6.8 Closing the cover



- Position the cover (2) and screw into place using 4x sealing screws M4 (Torx 20) (1).
- There is a possibility of sealing at the tab formed (3).

7 Material defects
